# One Life Changed by the Power of the Resurrection

Without Jesus' resurrection we have put our hope in a dead man. Because of Jesus' resurrection our faith rests in the one who changes all things and brings us peace with God giving us eternal life.

## Transformed by Jesus

Soon afterward Jesus began a tour of the nearby towns and villages, preaching and announcing the Good News about the Kingdom of God. He took his twelve disciples with him, along with some women who had been cured of evil spirits and diseases. Among them were Mary Magdalene, from whom he had cast out seven demons;

Luke 8:1-2 (NLT)

- What happened to her by having a personal relationship with Jesus?
- What happens to us in a personal relationship with Jesus?

#### Witness to Jesus' Death

Some women were there, watching from a distance, including Mary Magdelene, Mary (the mother of James the younger and of Joseph), and Salome.

Mark 15:40 (NLT)

- What did she witness in the crucifixion of Jesus?
- What does Jesus' crucifixion mean for us?

## At Jesus' Burial

Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joseph saw where Jesus' body was laid.

Mark 15:47 (NLT)

- What did she see when Jesus was buried?
- What does it mean?

#### At Jesus' Resurrection

Early on Sunday morning, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and found that the stone had been rolled away from the entrance. She ran and found Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved. She said, "They have taken the Lord's body out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!"

Peter and the other disciple started out for the tomb. They were both running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He stooped and looked in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he didn't go in. Then Simon Peter arrived and went inside. He also noticed the linen wrappings lying there, while the cloth that had covered Jesus' head was folded up and lying apart from the other wrappings. Then the disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in, and he saw and believed—for until then they still hadn't understood the Scriptures that said Jesus must rise from the dead. Then they went home.

## Personal Encounter with the Resurrected Jesus

Mary was standing outside the tomb crying, and as she wept, she stooped and looked in. She saw two white-robed angels, one sitting at the head and the other at the foot of the place where the body of Jesus had been lying. "Dear woman, why are you crying?" the angels asked her.

"Because they have taken away my Lord," she replied, "and I don't know where they have put him."

She turned to leave and saw someone standing there. It was Jesus, but she didn't recognize him. "Dear woman, why are you crying?" Jesus

asked her. "Who are you looking for?"

She thought he was the gardener. "Sir," she said, "if you have taken him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will go and get him." "Mary!" Jesus said.

She turned to him and cried out, "Rabboni!" (which is Hebrew for "Teacher").

"Don't cling to me," Jesus said, "for I haven't yet ascended to the Father. But go find my brothers and tell them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'"

Mary Magdalene found the disciples and told them, "I have seen the Lord!" Then she gave them his message.

John 20:11-18 (NLT)

- What did she think, feel and finally believe?
- What are you thinking, feeling and what will you believe?

#### How to become a Christian

Many people believe they are Christians because they were born in a Christian culture, go to church regularly, try to do their best, or live a good life. However, the Bible teaches that these things cannot make you a Christian. You become a Christian by simply taking these two steps:

- Acknowledge that you (along with all people) have sinned and fallen short of God's standards. Romans 3:23
- Personally believe that Jesus Christ, who was God in human flesh, died for your sins on the cross and rose again.
  1 CORINTHIANS 15:3, 4

You may express your belief through prayer, asking Jesus to come into your life, and receiving Him as God's gift to you.
