Brothers, we do not want you to be ignorant about those who fall asleep, or to grieve like the rest of men, who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him.

How to Become a Christian

Many people believe they are Christians because they were born in a Christian culture, go to church regularly, try to do their best, or live a good life. However, the Bible teaches that these things cannot make you a Christian. You become a Christian by simply taking these two steps:

- Acknowledge that you (along with all people) have sinned and fallen short of God's standards. Romans 3:23
- Personally believe that Jesus Christ, who was God in human flesh, died for your sins on the cross and rose again.

You may express your belief through prayer, asking Jesus to come into your life, and receiving Him as God's gift to you.

Hope of the Resurrection

The resurrection of the dead allows us to live, die and proclaim with power, hope and passion.

Then Paul, knowing that some of them were Sadducees and the others Pharisees, called out in the Sanhedrin, "My brothers, I am a Pharisee, the son of a Pharisee. I stand on trial because of my hope in the resurrection of the dead." ACTS 23:6 (NIV84)

The _____ of the Resurrection in the Book of Acts

- 1. Christ's resurrection was a <u>prerequisite</u> for replacing Judas and finding a 12th apostle. (Acts 1:22)
- 2. Christ's resurrection was <u>predicted</u> in Psalm 16:8-11 and fulfilled Psalm 2:7. (ACTS 2:22-32; 13:33-37)
- 3. Christ's resurrection was <u>proclaimed</u> with great power and central to the apostles' preaching. (AcTs 4:2, 10, 33)

With great power the apostles continued to testify to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and much grace was upon them all.

ACTS 17:31 (NIV84)

- 4. Christ's resurrection <u>positioned</u> him for exalted authority at God's right hand. (AcTs 5:31)
- 5. Christ's resurrection was *purposely* witnessed by Godchosen people. (AcTS 10:40-41)
- 6. Christ's resurrection *points* to a future judgment. (Acts 17:31)

In the past God overlooked such ignorance, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent. For he has set a day when he will judge the world with justice by the man he has appointed. He has given proof of this to all men by raising him from the dead.
