Prayer: Connecting with God Why Should We Pray?

Luke 18:1-8 (ESV)

And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. ² He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor respected man. ³ And there was a widow in that city who kept coming to him and saying, 'Give me justice against my adversary.' ⁴ For a while he refused, but afterward he said to himself, 'Though I neither fear God nor respect man, ⁵ yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will give her justice, so that she will not beat me down by her continual coming.' " ⁶ And the Lord said, "Hear what the unrighteous judge says. ⁷ And will not God give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long over them? ⁸ I tell you, he will give justice to them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

How to Become a Christian

- Acknowledge that you (along with all people) have sinned and fallen short of God's standards. Romans 3:23
- Personally believe that Jesus Christ, who was God in

human flesh, died for your sins on the cross and rose again. 1 Corinthians 15:3, 4

You may express your belief through prayer, asking Jesus to come into your life, and receiving Him as God's gift to you. John 1:12, Romans 6:23, Revelation 3:20
